Free Tax Preparation!

Do you know about the free Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA)? The VITA program offers free tax help to people who generally make \$60,000 or less, persons with disabilities and limited English speaking taxpayers who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns. IRS-certified volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals. VITA preparers help qualifying taxpayers receive important credits like the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). This refundable credit is worth up to \$6,935 for households who made less than \$59,187. Nearly one in five taxpayers who are eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit don't claim it on their return. Nationwide, about \$7 billion in EITC benefits go unclaimed each year. Therefore, it is important for all to know what credits they qualify for.

If you made \$30,000 or less last year, the State of California has tax credits you should know about: the California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC), the Young Child Tax Credit (YCTC), and the new Foster Youth Tax Credit. California allows ITIN holders to claim these two tax credits. This means that individuals do not need a social security number to claim these credits making more Californians eligible. If you want to file a tax return but cannot obtain a valid SSN, there are IRS Acceptance Agents and Taxpayer Assistance Centers available to help persons apply.

Getting a tax refund this year? Don't have an account? There is still time to <u>#GetBanked</u>.

The fastest way to get your tax refund is to have it electronically deposited for free into your bank account with a direct deposit. You can even split your refund through a direct deposit to your checking account and your savings account!

Many FDIC-insured banks offer accounts with low (or no) monthly maintenance fees when you have direct deposit or maintain a minimum balance. They may also offer free access to in-network automated teller machines (ATMs). And, your deposits are insured up to \$250,000. Learn more about the <u>top reasons to open a</u> <u>bank account.</u> This is a great time to start or expand your Emergency Fund. Banks offer many types of accounts and programs, so there is likely one that can meet your specific needs. <u>This checklist</u> can help you choose the best type of account for your individual needs.
